

Checklist: Protecting Your Business as a Streamer

- Create a [business entity](#) to perform your services through.
 - Create and maintain all necessary documentation for the business (Operating Agreements, Bylaws, Shareholders' Agreements, etc.)
- Register your entity with the appropriate governing bodies.
 - [State and federal agencies.](#)
- Set up a separate bank account for your business which is used SOLELY FOR BUSINESS EXPENSES.
- [Trademark your name.](#)
- Be aware of and abide by your streaming platform's community guidelines and terms of service.
 - This can include guidelines for: Violence/threats, hateful conduct/harassment, sexual content, copyrighted content, etc.
- Consider purchasing a license to access a library of music to play during your stream.
 - You can also use the music on [Twitch's Music Library](#) for free.
- Thoroughly review each contract that you receive, including [sponsorship agreements](#), and enter into any acceptable agreement on behalf of your business entity.
- [Fully disclose](#) any sponsorships or endorsements [when activating them](#).
- Do not make any slanderous remarks on your stream about other people.
- Pay your taxes.
